Food Drive for Iglesia's Pantry

You are invited to bring donations to the box in the Parish Hall to help the members of Iglesia. The people who attend Iglesia Luterana de Santa Cruz in Santa Maria are the poorest of the poor. Iglesia is a mission start-up church based at Bethel Lutheran. We have become partners in their ministry and continue to support their ministry. Pastor Esteban Salazar and his wife Angie, are very enthusiastic and have so many exciting plans to develop the scope and mission of Iglesia Luterana. Iglesia serves many families in their congregation through their food pantry, which is a shed on the church grounds at Bethel. In addition, we contribute gift cards so that families may purchase meat, fresh vegetables, dairy products and other necessities such as diapers.

To contribute funds to this project and have us do the shopping, you can earmark your donation "**Iglesia Food**" and drop it in the offering plate or at the church office. We have applied for assistance from Thrivent Financial

in conjunction with the Christmas Angel Gift Project, which will also help us to purchase food items for Iglesia during the first part of 2017.

The most needed items at this time to re-stock Iglesia's pantry include: 5 lb. bags of white flour, 5 lb. bags of white rice, 3 lb. bags of Pinto beans, Canned chicken (*no tuna, please!*), Peanut Butter,,Breakfast Cereal and Breakfast Bars, Canned Vegetables (Corn, Green Beans, Refried Beans, Peas, Mixed Vegetables), Large cans of Hominy, Canned Soups (Chicken Noodle or Beef), Diapers (any size, age), Toilet Paper. *Items for the Youth program:* Packaged Cookies, Microwave Popcorn, Snack Crackers, Juice (Apple Fruit Punch, Lemonade, Orangeade)

Bethania has Angels as Members



Thank you to all of our Christmas Angels who helped with the gifts for our 54 Iglesia children and the 4 Preschool/After School children. This was the largest Christmas Angel event yet with 58 children to shop for, and I am so proud to say that Bethania members and friends really stepped up to this challenge.

The members of Iglesia Luterana are primarily of indigenous Oaxacan descent; most do not speak English but may be able to get by with some Spanish, as their primary language is a native dialect. Their pastor communicates in Spanish and those who speak only the indigenous dialect(s) have the Spanish

translated to their language by others. They attend a start-up church about 40 miles north of us located on the premises of Bethel Lutheran Church in Santa Maria. The parents of these children struggle during the off-season months to have enough food for their families and other necessities. Christmas presents are non-existent for the majority of these children. We worked with their pastor and his wife, and the children's "wish lists" they dictated to church helpers, to purchase as many of their wants as was possible. We concentrated on focusing on warmer clothing and shoes with the inclusion of at least one toy for each child. In total we were "Christmas Angels" to 54 children of both genders, ranging in age from newborn to age 19. The presents were wrapped and delivered to the church in three vehicles for distribution to the children. The joy of the children and the gratitude of their parents is overwhelming, as the only gift that most of them will get was from our "angels".

We also supported three local families whose children attend our own Bethania Preschool and After School Program with gifts. These families are our neighbors who are struggling with their financial challenges. The children were chosen by Director Eileen Knotts for assistance this Christmas season. We are very happy to be able to help some children who are attending our wonderful program based here at Bethania.

By focusing our drive on working together for the goal of meeting the needs of each child, we accomplished more. We encouraged people of all ages and abilities to participate. All sizes of monetary donations were given, ranging from spare change to \$200. We promoted the concept of "we can do the shopping for you" so that people who did not have the time or were physically unable to go shopping could participate. Thankfully we had many wonderful people agree to shop for their "adopted" child, which really helped with the task.



Additional donated items received which did not meet the "wishes" or guidelines for the children were distributed to other church families in need, and shelter families.

I believe we are inspired to give generously with the knowledge of the difficulty many of these families face. They work hard at picking fruit and vegetables in the fields, and struggle with acceptance in so many areas of their lives, including trying to be accepted by the Spanish-speaking Latino majority. Even though their fieldwork is hard and the pay is not high, they still

feel proud to be able to work hard and give their families better lives than they had in Oaxaca. Their hard work, positive outlook and gratitude for even the smallest things in their lives inspire us to do our best to help others, even if our donations are small on their own. It is a privilege to be able to help them and their families in a small way. We are also grateful to be able to share the love of Christ during the Christmas season with our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Thank you all for your generous hearts and loving help with this project. Congregational Business

Council Meeting

- Council met for its final meeting of 2016 at the home of Nancy Emerson on Dec. 15th.
- New members for 2017, Ann Tucker and Ken Faulk, were welcomed, and departing members Alma Lancaster and Nancy Emerson were thanked for their service with cards from Council.
- Marilyn Larsen was thanked for her 4 years of service as Council President with a lovely Christmas cactus from the Council members.
- A new Executive Committee was elected to serve for the 2017 church year. Your new leaders are:

- A new list of revisions to the Constitution from the Synod was approved by Council to be presented to the congregation for approval at our February annual meeting. These are mostly roster revisions and do not effect our congregation but need to be in our constitution to meet Synod requirements.
- Pastor Chris presented the decision from Christian Education that Sunday School will be moving to the 5pm service beginning Jan. 8th. The decision was made because there are many more children attending the evening service than the 9:30 service and it was agreed that Sunday School should be offered where the need is.

Treasurer's Report for November 2016

Balance Sheet:

- The cash position has declined in part due to two months of benevolence being paid in November (we did not submit benevolence payment to Synod in October).
- All liabilities are current with the exception of the pension fund liability.
- Cash position is normal for this time of the year.
- There was a slight decline in net income (-\$1,473) for the month (again due to double benevolence payment).

Profit & Loss Budget Performance:

Income:

- Regular member offerings were down \$2,816 from budget. Non-member offerings were up \$367 for month. Overall offerings were at 100% of budget for the first 11 months.
- Other receipts were up by \$854.
- Child care reimbursements were up, as pre-school paid share of cost for liability insurance this month.
- Facility use receipts continue to be strong, with nearly \$6,500 in net income for the first 11 months.
- Overall, income for the first 11 months is at 103% of budget.

Expenses:

- Benevolence (synod support) is up as we paid two months (October & November) in the month of November
- Salary & benefits are up \$741 over budget (family ministry director position fully funded). However, overall salary & benefits are at 97% of budget through the end of November
- Staff expenses are down, with 80% of budget through November
- Office expenses are up slightly over budget for the month, but remain at 125% of budget for the first 11 months of the year.
- With the exception of utilities, all other expenses are at or below budget.
- Expenses for the month were over budget, but were at 99% of budget through November
- There was a slight surplus of \$2,252 for the month of November.

Overall:

Bethania continues to be in a healthy financial position. God has blessed us richly as a congregation with good stewards who contribute their time and talents to the Lord. Expenses are well controlled and reflect good stewardship of the gifts that our members give to support the work of the Lord in our community. Thanks Be To God!

Letter About the 2017 Budget

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ:

At our Congregational meeting on Sunday, November 20, we elected new leadership for our church, approved changes to our Constitution and By-Laws, and approved the budget for 2017. Thanks to all who attended and gave their support to all of these important decisions.

The 2017 budget is a budget of faith, as it shows a deficit of \$18,575. This is an exciting budget for us, as it reflects our commitment to the Family Ministry Director position, and an outreach of a second service, as well as increased budget for youth activities and a Vacation Bible School! After that meeting, several members asked how we could eliminate that deficit.

How do we as a faith community respond to God's call to these ministries through our giving? I have referred to this budget as the "Mustard Seed" budget, as we must have the faith of the mustard seed, which is a very small seed, but grows into large plants that spread rapidly. We are blessed with approximately 145 family giving units that support Bethania Lutheran Church through their weekly (or monthly) offering. If each of these giving units would consider an increased gift of \$2.50 a week, (\$130 a year) we would eliminate the proposed deficit. For less than the cost of a glass of wine, or a latte' our "Mustard Seed" will grow and flourish as we reach out to the community and continue to nourish our own members and their families.

We know that many of our members are on a fixed income and may not be able to increase their giving, and we are grateful for their faithful offerings. For those that are able, we ask for God's guidance and wisdom as we all prayerfully consider this faith budget going forward in 2017.

Thanks be to God for all of you!
