What Are You Going to Give Up?



So what are you giving up for Lent? This is a common question that comes up every year during this time. I can recall back to my youth, even my non-church going friends would ponder giving something up and even commit to the task during the 40 days of Lent. It was treated as a game – who could last all 40 days or who gave up the most difficult thing. Kids remain some of the wisest people in our world showing us adults what we really look like minus the energy of trying to cover it up for fear of what others might think.

In many ways we still approach Lent with this mindset. Either we choose a task to give up as though the struggle or accomplishment will make us more worthy, or, we choose not to participate in Lent in this kind of a way because we think God really doesn't care – which I think is true.

Regardless, Lent is a time of practice, a time of action, a time of devotion, and most importantly, it's intentional time coming closer to God. Especially as we read the Gospel of Matthew during this Lenten year, it is a time where we come closer to God by understanding baptism.

The practice of Lent came from the early church. As this new faith was spreading and more and more people wanted to be a part of it, they participated in forty days of preparation, prayer and contemplation before committing in baptism on Easter. While some churches still use Lent for this purpose, at Bethania Lent is a time in our personal lives and as a community to be closer to God through similar practices. So this year I'd like to look at Baptism as a medium to come closer to God.

During the course of Lent we will be looking at Baptism in our Sunday service and in our weekly Wednesday Dinner Church and what it means for us as followers of Christ. But for now I want you to read what Paul writes in his letter to the Romans, chapter 6, verses 4 and 5: "We were therefore buried with him [Jesus] through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly also be united with him in a resurrection like his." We read that baptism is merely our life without Christ versus our life with Christ. It's as simple as that.

So if you want to pick up Lenten practice this season, here's what I recommend. Whether it's giving something up or taking something on (dedicated time for prayer, an act of kindness, choosing to meditate, reading a daily devotional, etc.) make sure its central focus is coming closer to God, and do that by reflecting on aspects of your life apart from Christ and aspects of your life with Christ. Ask yourself if your life is the same apart from Christ or if you feel like your life is richer in Christ. And please note when I say apart from Christ, I don't mean the evangelical definition of "before you were saved", but more the lived parts of your life that don't include Jesus in them, of which we have many.

Lent is a very special time of the year and I worry we've trivialized it by treating it like a task to complete or attempt. Lent is about understanding our life in Christ (baptism). It is about trying to understand in a deeper way how much and how unconditionally we are loved by Christ, how we avoid understanding that love by the superfluous activities we fill our time with, and how much more rich our lives become in living our lives through God's love and grace. And if this sounds confusing or fluffy, bear with me – hopefully it will become clearer as we enter this Lenten season.

All that is asked of Visitation Team members is to check in with a few people a couple times a month at your convenience and see how they're doing. It's that simple, yet it's incredibly meaningful. You'll also find that this will be one of the most rewarding experiences you'll ever have, and I can't stress that enough. You'll hear the most amazing stories and you'll develop connections that will stick with you for the rest of your life. Noisy Sunday: Making Change Count

February's "Noisy Offering" benefitted Iglesia Luterana Santa Cruz. These funds will be used to help our friends in Santa Maria during the difficult winter months, when work is hard to find in the fields. Our offering of \$349.50 will be used towards food items, emergencies or whatever is required. Thank you to everyone who contributed - it will make a difference for so many hard-working families.

The next "Noisy Sunday" is coming on March 19th. Our donations from the offering will be used to support Domestic Violence Solutions for Santa Barbara County.

What will our donations be used towards?

\$50 allows 10 teens to attend a Workshop on Healthy Relationships in a Junior High or High School.

\$100 buys one day of food, shelter and support for a mother and her two children.

\$250 provides one woman with domestic violence counseling for 3 months.

\$500 allows a Shelter Advocate to respond with police to all 9-1-1 domestic violence calls for a week.

\$750 provides 3 months of outings and activities for 10 children living at the shelter. \$1,000 keeps their Hotline Service running 24-hours a day for one month.

Last year, thanks to donors like you, Domestic Violence Solutions for Santa Barbara County:

- Provided 10,676 nights of emergency shelter for women and children;
- Answered 4,080 crisis calls;
- Helped 887 victims get legal assistance;
- Responded to 459 calls from local police;
- And much more.

Your donation is not only helping save lives now, it's helping to prevent domestic violence in the future.

March 8th is International Women's Day: a global day celebrating the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women. The day also marks a call to action for accelerating gender parity. At Bethania, we have recently supported educational scholarships for PACE in India, continue to contribute notions to the women's shelter and to victims of domestic violence, and recently gave socks, hats, gloves and as support for homeless women and men.

Concentrating on women's issues here in our Santa Barbara County, domestic violence touches the lives of women and children daily. Domestic Violence Solutions of Santa Barbara County is dedicated to:

- Providing safe and confidential shelter for battered women and their children throughout Santa Barbara County.
- Providing emotional support and personal advocacy to battered women and other women in crisis, enabling them to recognize strengths and resources within themselves. We encourage women to be empowered to be free to make choices.
- Playing a leadership role in effecting social change by educating the community, by associations with other social change groups and by supporting the work of women's rights organizations.

Here are some facts to keep in mind:

- Domestic violence is not solely a woman's issue, nor is it solely a man's issue. However, the vast majority of victims of domestic violence are women.
- Domestic violence is about power and control.
- Domestic violence is not a relationship problem. A person using power and control over another is entirely responsible for his/her behavior and the outcome.
- Domestic violence affects all people in our society, not only the victim and the perpetrator.
- Domestic violence is child abuse; it is a learned behavior; it affects the whole family and is cyclical and intergenerational.
- Domestic violence feeds on silence.

What You Can Do

If you are in immediate danger CALL 911.

Report domestic violence when you see or hear it happening. Domestic violence is not a private family matter-- it's a crime. Call 911.

You can help by learning more about domestic violence through visiting the Domestic Violence Solutions website. If interested, you might consider attending the 40-Hour DV Advocacy Certification. This is a series of classes that prepares participants to work directly with victims and perpetrators of domestic violence. A new class begins this March in SB and May in SM (see website for more details).

We all really “make change for the better” with the Noisy Sunday! So bring your coins and make some noise on March 19th. Together, we can CHANGE a woman’s world - and change our world.

Food Drive for Iglesia’s Pantry Continues

You are invited to bring donations to the box in the Parish Hall to help the members of Iglesia. Iglesia serves many families in their congregation through their food pantry, which is a shed on the church grounds at Bethel in Santa Maria. In addition, we contribute gift cards so that families may purchase items such as meat, fresh vegetables, dairy products and other necessities, such as diapers.

Iglesia Luterana is a mission start-up church based at Bethel Lutheran. The new interim, Pastor Esteban Salazar and his wife Angie, are very enthusiastic and have so many exciting plans to develop the scope and mission of Iglesia Luterana. The members of Iglesia are mainly field workers, who depend on the strawberry crops and other picking jobs for income. During this time of year, their incomes are minimal. Many of these families support extended family members who are single parents or parentless children. They are very proud people who work hard, and who appreciate their brothers and sisters in Christ supporting them in their efforts to make a better life for their loved ones.

If you would like to contribute funds to this project and have us do the shopping, you can earmark your donation “**Iglesia Food**” and drop it in the offering plate or at the church office.

We encourage everyone to become more educated about families who are the “working poor” and who struggle every day to feed their families in our area.

If you would like to donate, items most needed at this time to re-stock the pantry for Iglesia families include:

5 lb. bags of white flour, 5 lb. bags of white rice, 3 lb. bags of Pinto beans, Canola Oil (used for cooking tortillas), Canned chicken (no tuna, please!), Canned Vegetables (Corn, Green Beans, Refried Beans, Peas, Mixed Vegetables), Large cans of Hominy (very popular and relatively inexpensive if you watch for a sale), Canned Soups (Chicken Noodle or Beef), Peanut Butter, Breakfast Cereal and Breakfast Bars, Diapers (any size, age)

Items which Pastor Esteban could use for the Youth program: **Packaged Cookies, Microwave Popcorn, Juice (Apple Fruit Punch, Lemonade, Orangeade), Snack Crackers**

Treasurer's Report - January 2017 Financial Statement

Balance Sheet:

- The most significant change in the balance sheet is the addition of the cemetery fund, the increase in the 2016 endowment fund balance, and the addition of the new preschool building. This represents a major step forward in consolidating our church assets into one combined balance sheet. We still need to add the value of the cemetery land, and hopefully that will be done in the next month. The combined current assets of the church are \$3,313,752.
- The cash position is strong and all accounts are current, with no additional demand on the cash recorded.
- The only current non-fund balance liability is the pension liability of \$1,371.

Profit & Loss Budget Performance:

Income:

- Offerings were up in January by \$412 or 102% of budget. This is a good first month indicator of our members response to the budget presented!
- Other income was down, largely due to not transferring the funds for the youth fund from the designated funds. This transfer will be done in February.
- Child care reimbursements are down, as the preschool did not pay the reimbursement to the church until February. That will reverse out during the next month.
- Total income was 87% of budget. However when we factor in the child care reimbursement and the youth fund monies, we would have been over budget by \$668, or 102% of budget.

Expenses:

- Benevolence is over budget due to the increase in giving.
- Salary and benefits are slightly over budget due to increased worship musicians, and guest pastor in January.
- Staff expenses are within budget.
- Office administration continues to be an issue of being over budget. Copier expense, office supplies, and postage seem to be the problem area. I will be meeting with Kristyl to determine if there are ways we can reduce these expenses to stay within budget.
- Utilities are under budget.
- All other expenses are at or under budget.

Overall:

For the first month of the new year, we were \$2,759 expenses over income. However, factoring in the youth fund and child care reimbursement timing would have reversed that number. God continues to bless Bethania with dedicated staff and committed congregational members to do His work in our community. God is Good!
