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Pastor Chris's Message

As I sit at my desk writing this letter I can find comfort in taking pause if I need to because I know the hustle and bustle of Lent and Easter are behind us for the year. It feels good to take a breath and know that I have the time and capacity to sit and reflect. Although I realize this is a temporary lull as a screaming, kicking, time and energy consuming blessing is on her way in a few more months.

However, within this lull I am finally able to get back to reflecting and planning on the road ahead for Bethania and what that looks like.

I've begun doing some research again on church growth and I've come across two interesting pieces of information I'd like to share.

The first is a recent survey from Gallup that was released April 14. The survey asked adults that represented the spectrum of church attenders across the United States why they went to church and the responses are rather insightful. Here are the top three responses: when asked what was a major factor in attending church 75% of people said it was the quality sermons, 64% said it was spiritual programs geared at children and high school age youth, and 59% said it was lots of community outreach and volunteer opportunities.

Of these three responses only one of them is an area in which I have exclusive control. Other than telling me I'm doing okay in the pulpit or totally bombing there's not much the congregation can do to provide quality sermons. However, the other two are areas that can only be done successfully as a church. To be a place thriving with volunteer opportunities and youth programs, we need people to help organize, teach, lead, or simply lend a helping hand.

The second piece of information is an article I read by Rick Warren, lead pastor of Saddleback Church, a California church with a membership of about 20,000 people. The article was written in 2013 and is called, "8 Step to Grow Your Church". I'm not going to recap the entire article, but just mention the number one reason he gives to grow a church. He says the primary barrier to church growth is that the church doesn't really desire to grow.

What he means is that while a church may say it wants to grow, often its actions don't match that desire. In other words, the people want the church to grow, but they don't want to be the ones to make it happen. Or another way to look at it is that small churches only know how to act like small churches, but must act like bigger churches if they want to see growth.

I'm not using this as a way to criticize our own church. As far as averages go, a church that worships at least 90 people a Sunday is an above average church. As a church that worships about 150 a Sunday, we're doing pretty well. I'm not as concerned with church growth, as I am with church sustainability. The Church in general is moving into new territory, and I'm convinced the only way it will be sustainable is if everyone is involved. The best thing for a church is for a pastor to be able to go on vacation, and aside from the sermon, no one knows he or she is gone.

So I would like each of you to consider this question: Do you really want Bethania to grow? If your answer is yes, then ask yourself, "How can I help make that happen?" We have some wonderful ways to be involved at Bethania, so please read on to see what they are. And if you feel like you have the desire, but you're not really sure what to do, I invite you to come chat with me about it, and I promise you we'll figure something out. I so look forward to the future of our church and I'm thrilled to continue to be here as your pastor. Thanks for your commitment to this church and its mission.

Helping our Friends at Iglesia

Thank you to all who contribute shopping money and food items for the Food Pantry at Iglesia Luterana Santa Cruz. With Bethania's support, we have really been helping make the lives of many families better.

Iglesia serves many families in their congregation through their food pantry, which is a shed on the church grounds at Bethel. The people who attend Iglesia Luterana in Santa Maria are the poorest of the poor in the area. The majority of their people are field workers. Pastor Esteban was sharing some heart breaking stories about his members with Pastor Chris and me at a recent lunch get-together.

One of his members is a field worker who works broccoli fields. She leaves Santa Maria between 3 and 4 am each day, and is trucked to different fields in the state, returning at around 8 pm each evening. Her hands are blistered and raw. She is suffering from some serious medical issues, but does not have the funds or the time to get medical treatment. Thanks to those who have contributed, Pastor Esteban and his wife are able to provide her family one home-cooked meal twice a week for her children and her. This is a huge difference in her world.

Pastor Esteban and Pastor Chris are discussing setting up a new way to help with members of Iglesia's needs. We will have more information to come.

Noisy Offering May 28th supports this camp!

Circle V Ranch Camp is traditional summer camp with activities including hiking, swimming, nature, archery, drumming, arts & crafts, painting, sports, campfires, skits & songs. Programs are designed for each camper to participate in innovative and enriching outdoor experiences that build self-esteem, expand knowledge and appreciation of others, nature and God. Campers stay in cabins or conventional canvas tents and enjoy 3 nutritious daily meals served family-style in the Dining Lodge—supervised by caring, trained counselors and long-time staff. Campers are mostly inner-city children who have never before experienced camp or nature activities. Circle V Ranch Camp embraces youth-centered programming and is committed to the growth and development of children through positive, meaningful and rewarding activities.

Circle V Ranch Camp was founded by the Society of St. Vincent de Paul Council of Los Angeles in 1945, and has been located on 30 acres in the Los Padres National Forest in Santa Barbara County's Santa Ynez Valley since 1990. The camp is at 2550 Hwy. 154 - right here in our backyard. The "Friends of Circle V" were founded in early 2012, all volunteers who support the mission of Circle V Ranch Camp in the Santa Ynez Valley—to provide a traditional, sleep-over summer camp experience in a safe, nurturing environment for kids ages 7-13. There are no dues to become a "Friend" of Circle V—just a commitment to help!

Most children who attend (or want to attend) Circle V Ranch Camp need financial assistance. Of the 1,255 campers who attended in Summer 2013, 95.5% received full or partial scholarships known as "camperships" to help their family pay the fees. (Camperships are around \$450 per child, with family's paying a percentage according to a sliding scale.)

We will begin collecting items to help meet the camp's needs for this year in the Parish Hall. We will also be donating a "Noisy Offering" on May 28th towards purchases for their needs.

Final Report on 2017 Piyali Learning Center Scholarships

Thanks to your generosity, we were able to send \$1,858 to PACE Universal for the Piyali Learning Center. \$1,275 funded scholarships for our two 10-year olds, Rehka and Reshma, whom we have sponsored since they entered kindergarten in 2012 (\$375 each) and our three young women, Arabi, Rama and Suparna (\$175 each) in the literacy and vocational program. The additional \$583 will help with the school's expansion to serve more students.

Council Highlights - April 20, 2017

Council will be getting together Thursday May 25th to discuss growing leadership at Bethania.

After reviewing concerns about the placement of a Pantry Cupboard on the side of the church, council took a small tour of the property to consider alternative sites. It was decided that placing the cupboard on the south side of the office building would meet the criteria of camera monitoring, lighting, and public accessibility. Council voted to proceed with designing a cupboard in the office location that would be able to handle weather exposure, and approved the funds for submitting plans to Solvang Board of Architectural Review.

It was reported that a visitor on Easter expressed sensitivity to mold in the church and a suggestion was made about possible remediation in the church basement. Subject was tabled for further investigation.

In April, the Memorials Committee approved two expenditures: two silver-plated common cups for communion - up to \$200 and a vacuum for the church facilities - \$459.99

Treasurer's Report - March Financial Statement April 8, 2017

Balance sheet:

- Once again, we are seeing a depletion of the cash account in general checking. It now stands at \$11,808. This is a concern, as we had hoped that we would have enough cash reserve to offset the anticipated deficit for 2017 of \$18,575. If this balance continues to erode, we may be in the position to review expenditures and take action to reduce certain expenditures.
- The money market fund remains at \$92,481. Some of these dollars are other funds that we maintain (Farstrup-Mortensen, etc.) so they are not available to the church general fund.
- All assets are listed and are current.
- All liabilities are current with the exception of the usual pension fund liability.

Profit & Loss Budget Performance:

Income

- Regular member offerings were \$3,394 below the budget (\$14,106 vs. \$17,500 budgeted). For January through March, we were at 92% of budget.
- Non-member offerings for the month was \$197 below budget, however, January through March non-member offerings were at 104% of budget.
- Overall offerings were at 92% of budget for the first three months of the year.
- Other receipts, such as facility usage and miscellaneous, were \$297 above budget for the month, and at 103% of budget for the first three months.
- Overall income was \$3,958 below budget or 94% of budget.

Expenses:

- Benevolence was down due to offerings being down for the month, or 97% of budget.
- Salary & benefits were slightly over for the month (\$90), and over budget at 104%. (As noted last month, the primary amount over budget was for guest pastors.)
- Office administration was under budget by \$204 for the month, but still remain over budget for the first three months.
- Utilities were slightly under budget for the month and remain at 82% of budget for the first three months.
- Property expenses were over budget for the first three months at 112%. However, an additional unexpected repair expense to the parsonage of \$956 for the month contributed to the excess.
- All other expenses were at or under budget for the first three months.

Overall:

While we are meeting our current obligations, it is concerning that our member giving is under the budget both for the month, and for the first three months. As members of the congregation, we must carefully consider our giving patterns and give the "first fruits" to God. Bethania is growing and reaching out with new ministries that God has called us to. May God guide us as we prayerfully consider how to respond to His call to be faithful stewards. Praise God from whom all blessings flow!
