Council Highlights - Aug. 18, 2016

- Council approved hiring Livier Brown to fill the position of Family Ministry Director. She will begin working in that position the first of October. We know that the congregation will support her in her work to address the needs of our families and young adults as she begins the process of reaching out to, and bringing those families into a more active role in the life of Bethania.
- Council approved hiring Brandon "Dewey" Roberts for the position of music director for the new 2nd service which will begin in October.
- Council approved reinstating the Nominating Committee to begin looking for members willing to fill open positions on Church Council and the Endowment and Cemetery Committees if needed.
- Pastor Chris informed Council of a generous donation that has made it possible to buy pew Bibles for the church sanctuary. These have been ordered and will be placed in the pews as soon as they arrive.

****Personal Care Kit Items Still Needed!****

As part of the ELCA “Day of Service” on Sept. 25, we will be assembling both School Kits and Personal Care Kits in the Parish Hall. All ages and abilities are welcome to help – you can be a part of the “assembly line” no matter what your age or skill level. There are plenty of spaces for willing workers! You can count, gather, wrap, tie, box...fun for all ages as we see the piles mount and boxes fill up.

A short “set up” time will be held Saturday, Sept. 24th at 7 pm. We will need helpers to set up tables, layout supplies, band pencils and pens, and take off packaging. Snacks will be served.

On **Sunday, Sept. 25th**, we will need all helping hands available to assemble the kits and eat some delicious Æbleskiver to keep our strength up!

We have already met our goal of 200 items for the School Kits; now we need to collect supplies for the Personal Care Kits. We will continue to collect items for the final assembly day through Sept. 25th. Donation boxes are in the Parish Hall by the Sunday School office, or you may drop items off at the Church Office during the week.

Why Personal Care Kits? When LWR distributes these kits, it's often to people who have lost everything. Around the world people suffer each day because of lack of basic hygiene. In refugee camps and in the world's poorest communities, a few simple items can mean the difference between sickness and health, and life and death.

Why School Supplies? To the children who receive School Kits, these supplies mean the difference between getting an education or not. In the places where LWR works, even a few required supplies, like pens and paper, may be more than many families can afford. And when parents can only afford to send one of their children to school, girls rarely get priority...yet the education level of women has the biggest impact on entire communities. Thanks to funds from Thrivent Financial and our Noisy Offering, the purchase of the backpacks to pack the school items into has been granted for our use.

Items still needed are:

1. Bath size towels (light weight, between 20"x40" & 27"x52"), dark colors preferred
2. Bars of soap (4-5 oz., any brand, in original wrapping – 2 per kit)
3. Comb, sturdy wide toothed

Make Change for the Better

The next “Noisy Sunday” is coming on Sept. 18. The offering from that day will be used to help cover the shipping costs of both the Personal Care Kits and the School Kits that we will be sending to the Lutheran World Relief Warehouse. This offering helps Lutheran World Relief ship the kits to the people who need them. We send our kits to an “ingathering” day set up by LWR, so that there is no cost to us to ship them to the warehouse. *(Assembly day is the next week, on Sept.25th, and all hands are needed! See related article.)*

Why do we need to ask for shipping cost donations instead of using those funds for creating more kits? Here’s why: We plan to make 200 School Kits and over 100 Personal Care Kits. According to LWR, the approximate processing and shipping cost for each kit is as follows:

LWR Mission Quilt: (per quilt \$2.25)

LWR School Kit: (\$1.40 per kit)

LWR Personal Care Kit: (\$2.65 per kit)*

*Your gifts to the LWR Quilt & Kit Shipping Fund, for Personal Care Kits, also helps LWR cover the cost of providing a tube of toothpaste for each kit

Your quarters, dimes and nickels (and hopefully some dollars!) will help us ship both types of kits, which are desperately needed right now, according to LWR.

The Aug. 21st Noisy Offering total was \$144.50, which was split for use to help meet the needs of Solvang School teachers and other SYV children through People Helping People. Thank you for helping meet the needs of children and teachers, right here in the valley.

We continue to “make change for the better” with the Noisy Sunday offerings. So bring your coins and make a noise on Sept. 18th. Together, we can CHANGE the world!

Produce Table is Growing - Come and See!

As of Aug. 21, thanks to the generosity of our growers, buyers and helpers, you have donated \$1,270.96 towards our fight against World Hunger.

We have already gifted a goat, pig, mosquito netting, sheep, a grove of fruit trees, 7,000 water purification tablets, a community fish farm, sheep and many baby chicks. (We might be able to fund a pregnant heifer!) Your gifts carry God’s love to others, making a difference in their lives and in the world. More than 90% of your gift

goes to this work, with less than 10% used for administration and fundraising costs for the ELCA “Good Gifts” program to fight world hunger. When we add the Thrivent match of \$400.00 which we have qualified for, we are at a total of \$1670.96.

Following the Labor Day weekend, we will be concentrating on funding the SYV Extension of the Salvation Army, and Deputy Charlie Uhrig’s local projects which include Summer Camp for children who have never experienced Summer Camp, food distribution and assistance for stranded travelers and other local needs. We are also scheduled to receive a \$300 Thrivent Match if we can hit the additional \$900 mark for our own Santa Ynez Valley needs!

Are You Directing Your Thrivent Choice Dollars?

Their actions resulted in \$1,551 for the church and \$2,988 for the Preschool through July. Thank you for doing this. Treasurer's Report for Month of July 2016

Balance Sheet:

- Cash position continues to be strong with \$29,271 in general checking and \$96,346 in money market fund.
- Endowment & Heritage Funds show balances from beginning of year – they will be adjusted at the end of the year, which is normal accounting procedures.
- All liabilities are current and the only current liability is the pension fund or \$1,441.
- Our balance sheet is very healthy.

Profit & Loss: Budget Performance:

Income:

- Offerings for July were \$2,992 over the budgeted amount; offerings from January –July were \$9,969 above budget or 109%.
- Total income was \$1,634 over budget for July; total income for Jan.-Jul. was \$12,982 above budget (109%).

Expenses:

- Salary & Wages were below budget by \$1,107 for the month and \$7,184 below budget for Jan. – Jul 2016 (or 92% of budget).
- Staff expenses were below budget (80%).
- Office administration was over budget largely due to postage expenses (we will carry the postage through the rest of the year) and telephone expenses – we changed vendors and had to pay new installation charges for faster internet and better phone services.
- Property expenses are under budget for the month, and just slightly over for the months of January – July.
- All other expenses are either below or at budget for the month and for the first 7 months of the year.
- Overall our income for the first 7 months is 109% of budget and expenses are at 97% of budget.

Bethania Lutheran Church continues to be in solid financial condition. Our members are truly God's stewards and we are blessed with a Pastor who continues to minister to not only our members, but our community as well. God is good!

After attending a six month program through UCSB Extension, she became a Santa Barbara County Master Gardener. Throughout the country, the Master Gardener program provides gardening enthusiasts a venue to volunteer their time and learning to local residents. Recently, Master Gardener members from the north county have joined with the SYV Botanic Garden to tend the butterfly garden.

Janet enjoys reading and travel in her spare time. She has traveled to England to study Shakespeare at Trinity College in Cambridge, Costa Rica to learn Spanish, and Belize to scuba dive. She plans to attend her nephew’s graduation from boot camp in Fort Benning, Georgia, along with her mother, sister, and brother-in-law.

The Visitation Team is an incredible opportunity and ministry to reach out to these people. It can be quite lonely at times being restricted to a place, and a 15-minute conversation means the absolute world to those who receive a visit.

All that is asked of Visitation Team members is to check in with a few people a couple times a month at your convenience and see how they’re doing. It’s that simple, yet it’s incredibly meaningful. You’ll also find that this will be one of the most rewarding experiences you’ll ever have, and I can’t stress that enough. You’ll hear the most amazing stories and you’ll develop connections that will stick with you for the rest of your life.
