Pastor Chris's Message

There was once a man who was a devoted Christian. He went to church almost every Sunday, he ushered once a month, held a position on council and a couple different committees, tithed 10% of his income, and regularly volunteered for church events. He had grown up in this style, and for him, being involved in the routine of church life was a part of his identity. He was well liked by both his church family and his community.

This man probably could not be considered wealthy, but he lived a comfortable life due to the same obedience to routine in his career. He had lived in the same house for almost 30 years and aside from a mortgage that would almost be paid off, he did not have any debt and planned his retirement well.

He watched the news regularly and shared many of the same concerns about the rest of the world as his fellow Americans, but was also able to avoid letting those concerns penetrate the circle of his personal environment. The concerns that did affect him were the same as most people in his area: health, the occasional loss of loved ones, the fear that the world he built for himself might suddenly fall apart; but nothing so much as to cause any malcontent. If you were to ask this man if he had for want or need, both materially or spiritually, he would tell you no.

One Sunday this man was having an uncommon restless night. For some reason he could not seem to pass that thin line into the submission of sleep, but rather kept tossing from one position to another. As he inched closer to that submissive space something startled him and caused him to jump from any hope of slumber. He sat up in bed and standing there before him was Jesus. The man rubbed his eyes expecting this to be one of those weird dreams that existed between being awake and being asleep, but when he opened them again, Jesus was still standing there.

The Christ, the Messiah, the Son of Humanity was standing in his bedroom! What had he done to deserve the presence of all presence? Was this the moment that he was to depart this world and move into the next? Had Jesus come to escort him? He would take the journey if it was to be so, but something told him it was not. He had lived a life worthy of any Christian; maybe this was his reward. Maybe a man who lived life for his church and community deserved to be graced by the presence of Christ. But, why? Jesus must have something of great importance to tell him, just like the stories of old.

Imagining the story of Samuel with such obedience to his faith, the man spoke first, "Speak, for your servant is listening?" Jesus just looked back for what seemed like an eternity,

but was really only a moment. And then a smirk started to crawl onto his face, a smirk that had revelation behind it. Jesus' lips did not move but the man heard his voice in only a whisper. "You've gotten it wrong," the voice said. As soon as the voice had finished speaking the man was waking up to the sound of his alarm. He didn't know how long he had been asleep, but it felt like he had barely slept at all. Did that really happen last night or was it just a dream?

The man got out of bed and began his morning routine of getting ready for work. However, in the shower there were moments where he just stood there thinking about his dream. This happened again over breakfast and while he was getting dressed. On his way to work someone honked at him for not realizing a stoplight had turned green. He was 10 minutes late that day, which had never happened before. He could not make sense of why a dream would continue to affect him in such a way.

Work seemed to pass in spurts of slowed time and jumps ahead in which he didn't remember what he had done for the last 30 minutes. His wife noted his distance at dinner that evening, but he shook it off with the excuse of not getting enough sleep. He told her not to worry and left for his monthly church council meeting. Sitting around their conference table with people he knew as friends, they spoke of the monthly management of their church. Yet, in this space, for some reason, something was missing inside of him.

It's not that his church wasn't important or the work his friends were talking about at council was meaningless, but it was here in this moment that he felt the voice was pointing him to. For the first time as far back as his memory would allow, he felt a level of uncertainty about where he was and what he was doing. It was so overwhelming that he apologized and excused himself from the meeting and left to go home.

As he was driving, he could not stop thinking about that voice. "You've gotten it wrong?" What did he get wrong? Was it him, or was it everyone? Was it his church? Was it their work? Was it their beliefs? What had he gotten wrong? He had never questioned his faith before, but right now he couldn't find anything about it to fall back on and it was driving him mad; he wasn't even sure where he was driving. What had he gotten wrong? Was it his church, or was it The Church? He thought the way he had lived his life and the way he had committed himself to God had lead him to the gift of divine presence, but this didn't feel like a gift, it felt like punishment.

What had he gotten wrong? He needed an answer, he needed to find that place of certainty again. What had he gotten wrong? Now he started to say it out loud, "What have I gotten wrong, Lord? Speak to me again. Tell me what I'm missing. What have I gotten wrong? I go to church, I give my time and energy, I try to be a good person and ask for forgiveness when I fall short. I believe in justice and love for people and try to help when I can. Is all this wrong? What have I gotten wrong? WHAT HAVE I GOTTEN WRONG?!" He couldn't take it any more. He pulled to the side of the road and looked up to the heavens and screamed again, "WHAT HAVE I GOTTEN WRONG?!"

The stars looked beautiful that night. He couldn't remember the last time he had just looked at the stars. In the maddening whirl of his thoughts he had driven to the back hills just beyond his town without realizing it. The air was cool, but it wasn't uncomfortable and he

could hear the calm rustle of the wind. The chaos and discomfort of not knowing what this question meant was still present, but he felt a sense of peace come over him as he stood on the side of the road feeling the coolness of the night, looking at the stars. He remembered learning about constellations as a kid and how they guided the ancients in their travels, but he couldn't remember what any of them looked like. He just saw stars. They really were beautiful, almost glistening. As he continued to look, he could see a cluster of them resemble some kind of shape. Maybe it was one of the constellations of his past coming back to memory, but he wasn't sure. To him, they seemed to resemble a smirk.

Thanks to your generosity, we raised \$1,655 to continue providing \$375 scholarships for 11-year olds, Rekha and Resha, who we began supporting 7 years ago (2012) when they enrolled in pre-kindergarten. In addition we provided three, \$175 scholarships for mothers enrolled in Piyali Education Center's literacy and vocational education program. \$380 was given to the school to help support its educational initiatives.

I thought it would take a month or so to get the refrigerator, but it turned out I was able to buy it at Idler’s in Santa Maria and have it delivered to Iglesia a week later, the day before Easter. Since there was extra money, I asked Pastor Esteban and Angie what they would like. They asked for food for Easter. I was able to buy several hams, numerous packages of hot dogs, several dozen eggs, packages of candy, cookies, cans of coffee, bottles of instant coffee, bags of sugar, storage bags, and four gift cards for fresh food. The community of Iglesia shares food donations like these. After the Easter service, people took home bags of this bounty.

After the refrigerator was delivered and I dropped off the food, Pastor Esteban and Angie took the time to make me a burrito, refried beans and lemonade and talk for a while about their ministry at Iglesia. Many of you know that Bethania buys Christmas presents for the children of Iglesia each year. Bethania also supports Iglesia financially and with food, diapers, toilet paper and sanitary products. The congregation worships every week at Bethel Lutheran Church. After the service, Pastor Esteban and Angie hand out whatever food they can to anyone who needs it. They have a weekly Bible study with coffee and a light snack or lunch. They prepare meals in the kitchen at Bethel and take them to farm workers during the week as well as cook for various families who might need it. Pastor Esteban sees we have two hands - one with which to worship God and the other with which to help our neighbor.

I was glad to hear first-hand about this ministry and certainly glad to have done something to help Iglesia Luterana. I told Pastor Esteban and Angie that I have been blessed by helping them. By using a Thrivent Action card, I got raffle prizes and sold tickets. I was moved and uplifted to see so many people support this project: the congregations of Peace Lutheran, Lompoc; Gloria Dei, Orcutt; Bethel, Santa Maria; Mt. Carmel, San Luis Obispo; Calvary, Morro Bay; and of course, Bethania. I’m sure Hope, Atascadero and Bethel, Templeton would have contributed if I could have made it to them.

I am also grateful for donations from Ingeborg’s Chocolates, Casa Cassara for wine, and Olsen’s Bakery. The recipients of the five prizes were thrilled to win and help Iglesia at the same time.

Church Business

Treasurer's Report March 2018

Balance Sheet:

The checking account balance in the general operating fund shows a negative balance of \$1,823. This is largely due to the payment of the airline tickets for the Houston youth trip. The cash for the trip is currently in the designated fund account and should be moved over this month.

The Money market fund went down slightly as the Farstrup-Mortensen lecture series had \$5,395 in income and \$8,549 in expenses.

All liabilities are current, with no debt, with the exception of the normal pension liability of \$2,291.

Profit & Loss Budget Performance:

Income:

Offerings for the month were below budget by \$194 for the month. For the first three months, offerings were \$1,565 below budget or 97% of budget.

Other income for the month was up by \$1,347, and total income for the month was up by \$1,025. Total income for the first three months was up by \$12,501. However, of that amount, \$6,973 was for special benevolence and was paid out in prior months.

Facility use receipts were over budget for the month by \$1,396.

Expenses:

Salary and benefits were slightly over budget by \$328. This also included a guest pastor stipend of \$375 (paid in March, but not realized until April). For the first three months the salary & benefits were at 96% of budget. Staff expenses were within budget. Office administration was on budget for the month and were at 86% of budget for the first three months.

Property expenses were up for the month by \$772 largely due to some outside maintenance expenses for the church. However, for the first three months the expenses are at 907% of budget. Utilities for the month were under budget by \$339. For the first three months, utilities were over budget by \$1,139 largely due to increased electrical and natural gas usage during the first two months of very cold weather.

All other expenses were either at or below budget for the month and below budget for the first three months with the exception of the youth fund, which spent \$3,674 for the Houston servant trip (airfare).

Overall:

Bethania's members continue to support the mission and ministry through their stewardship. We are blessed to have faithful members and staff who truly show the love of Jesus to our community.

You must "spend" a given year's Dollars by March 31 of the following year. Local eligible charities include Bethania, Bethania Preschool and Solvang Lutheran Home.

A second program in which any Thrivent member can participate is Thrivent Action Team Grants. Bethania's Thrivent members have filled out a simple application online to obtain these grants for the following church charitable projects: Hike for Hunger, Preschool Playground Equipment, Lutheran World Relief Quilts and Personal and School Kits, Halloween Party, Iglesia Christmas Angel and Refrigerator projects. The team is volunteers helping with each project. The \$250 grant is not directly applied as a cash contribution, but is used to buy materials, food, flyers, etc. for the fundraising or service activity.
