## Pastor Chris's Message



Recently I participated in a local rally in Solvang Park to protest the separation and detention of children taken from their families upon crossing the border. It was very peaceful and most of the signs people brought were messages of love and welcome. I went to simply stand with a candle and show my support, but upon finding out there was a pastor in the crowd, someone approached and asked me if I would share some words. I was honored to stand and talk about the work we do in loving others, especially those who are vulnerable, I asked that we keep love at the forefront of what we do, and I asked for a moment of silence to think about the kids who are currently apart from their families and living in a space of uncertainty and probable fear.

A reporter from our local paper was there and he knows me well enough, so he asked for some quotes on the rally and took some pictures for the Thursday edition. After everything settled down, I was walking home knowing that this was going to be in the paper and aware that my name and words would be quoted, and I began to wonder what my congregation is going to think about this. I worried that I might be lumped into an ideological category and might upset the waters at our church. I worried that this would be a polarizing action that would potentially shut down conversation and just look similar to the anger and vitriol on social media. I worried that this would affect my ability to be a spiritual presence for people who might disagree with my choice to be at this rally.

The truth is I didn't go because I'm a Republican or Democrat, a conservative or a liberal, a person who is pro-immigration or a person who is in favor of stricter border control. I went because I'm a Christian and a pastor. I went because my encounter with our faith is one that calls us to rest in God's unconditional love for humanity and to reach out to the "least of these", the most vulnerable in society. I went because regardless of what one feels about immigration or the best route forward in reform, the immediate need in our society is a bunch of little children who are living in fear, and as a Christian and a pastor that's not something about which my faith allows me to be silent.

Something I love about Bethania is its diversity within the political spectrum. We have a pretty even split of people who identify as Republican or Democrat, and I think that's awesome! That's not common among a lot of churches. Many churches have a theology that runs one way or another and so their political identifications tend to parallel their theology. We're unique in this and I hope you know how special that is. The way we, as a church, understand our faith, bridges us in how we might identify politically and that's such an amazing sign of God's transcending love.

However, one of my great fears is that the political divide our country is facing might enter into our own church space. As I've read conversations around the news of children being separated, I've lamented how people have fallen into ideological camps, looking to blame the other side, arguing over immigration in general, all while these kids are still living in these encaged detention areas. I've lamented that while we are so divided as a nation, we can't even unite over the treatment of children. And I've wondered to myself, "Could this same divisiveness happen at Bethania?"

Here's where I find my grounding in this, and I hope you can take this as my pastoral advice or interpretation in this matter. We can advocate for these children without condemning ourselves, the party we affiliate with, others, or the party they affiliate with. We can rise above the politics and say that children should not be treated this way, that we need to work together to reunite those who've been separated, and we need to ensure this doesn't happen again. We have this unique ability to say this because our faith compels us to; because the God we follow and love is found in Jesus who directly reached out to children, some of the most vulnerable people of his time, and said, "Whoever welcomes this little child in my name, welcomes me... for it is the one who is least among you all who is the greatest." – Luke 9:46-47

Our faith should transcend our politics one hundred percent of the time, and scripture, from beginning to end, is the story of God reaching out to the most vulnerable among us in love and compassion. I love the diversity within our congregation so much; it's one of things I'm most proud of. I love that we come from many perspectives, many backgrounds, and many passions. I love that each Sunday that diversity gathers into one space to worship and praise God, and advocate for those in need among us. Right now, those children are the ones in need. As long as they remain separated and in this space of vulnerability, I will keep using my voice, not as a Republican or a Democrat, but as a Christian and a pastor.

By the time you read this, June's Noisy Offering of \$370.50 will be at the ELCA Youth Gathering in Houston. Pastor Chris, Livier and the Youth will be taking your donated coins which will be part of making a difference in the lives of farming families around the world.

What else is our change going to change this summer? We are going to help Lutheran World Relief make the world better for others, one coin and one kit at a time!

Our next Noisy Sunday will be July 22<sup>nd</sup>. We will be using our Noisy Offering funds towards the purchase of needed items to make up Personal Care Kits and School Supply kits. (Assembly day will be part of Day of Service, Sept. 9<sup>th</sup>).

On July 22<sup>nd</sup>, our jangling coins will be used to help purchase some of the pieces of the kits that we will make in September. With the ability to order in bulk through your donations, we can save some money and make more impact – and more kits!

Lutheran World Relief has been working with partners like us to reach out to families with School Kits and Personal Care Kits to places around the world. Since October 2011, LWR with our help has sent almost \$7.5 million worth of Quilts and Kits to Armenia, Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon and Serbia, to be distributed to Syrian refugees and locally affected communities - Doaa, Sindos, and Ghazal each received an LWR School Kit in 2017.

These distributions were made possible by the generosity of men, women, and children across the U.S. who spend countless hours collecting, assembling, packing and shipping LWR Quilts and Kits — and the people who support Lutheran World Relief's delivery of these gifts of love into the hands of people who need them.

## **Personal Care & School Supply Kit Items Needed!**

We will be collecting items this summer for assembly day of Personal Care Kits and School Supplies for Lutheran World Relief during the annual Day of Service on Sept. 9<sup>th</sup>.

You can help people dealing with some of life's most difficult situations –the aftermath of earthquakes and floods, fleeing home to escape violence, and living in extreme poverty. When LWR distributes Personal Care Kits, it's often to people who have lost everything. Natural disasters such as earthquakes and refugee camps are typical distribution areas for these kits. Around the world people suffer each day because of lack of basic hygiene. In refugee camps and in the world's poorest communities, a few simple items can mean the difference between sickness and health, and life and death.

Why school supplies? Imagine having to choose between a meal or purchasing a notebook. To the children who receive School Kits, these supplies mean the difference between getting an education or not. Public school is usually free, but in the places where LWR works, even a few required supplies, like pens and paper, may be more than many families can afford. And when parents can only afford to send one of their children to school, girls rarely get priority... yet the education level of mothers has the biggest impact on development.

Here are the items we are collecting. Watch for sales this summer and help us stock up!

### **Items needed are:**

#### **For Personal Care Kits:**

1. Bath size towels (light to medium weight, between 20"x40" & 27"x52"), dark colors preferred
2. Bars of soap (4-5 oz., any brand, in original wrapping – 2 per kit)
3. Toothbrush (adult size, in original packaging – bulk buys can be repackaged by us)
4. Comb, sturdy wide toothed
5. Nail clippers (with or without nail files)

#### **For School Supply Kits:**

70 sheet College ruled Notebooks (spiral bound)	Pencil sharpeners
Rulers with centimeters and inches	Blunt tip scissors
Ballpoint (not gel) Pens, Black or Blue ink	#2 Pencils
Box of Crayons (16 or 24 count)	2-1/2" Erasers

## **Church Business**

### **Treasurer's Report May 2018**

#### **Balance Sheet:**

The cash balance in the general checking account is \$2,161 and the cash in the money market fund is \$93,114.

One change to the balance sheet is the addition of an account 3100 "BLC Combined Equities". This amount more accurately reflects the actual amount of the church's financial picture. The number listed (\$2,168,522) is the total of the Endowment Fund, the Cemetery Fund, the Heritage Fund and the new pre-school building, the grading and excavation for the new that new building, and the cemetery property. These changes do not materially affect the funds or their usage, but aligns the funds in proper accounting to reflect the net worth of the church and its assets.

Again, there are no outstanding liabilities other than the pension fund, and all liabilities are current with no indebtedness.

The church balance sheet remains strong.

## **Profit & Loss Budget Performance:**

### **Income:**

Offerings for the month of May were \$1,537 higher than budget, and for the first five months were at 102% of budget. Thanks be to God!

Other income for the month was up by \$4,636 largely due to the youth fund monies for the Houston trip. For the first five months, the income was up by nearly \$7,000, again due to the youth trip.

Other receipts were up by \$1,588 (a contribution from the preschool to offset the replacement of toilets in the girls bathroom) contributed to this increase.

Overall income for the month was \$4,927 over budget, and for the first five months was at 116% of budget.

### **Expenses:**

Salary and benefits for the month were up slightly, but for the first five months were at 98% of budget.

Staff expenses were below budget for the month and are at 88% of budget for the first five months.

Office expenses were up for the month largely due to increased copier usage, but are well controlled at 96% of budget for the first five months.

Property expenses were up due to the replacement of three toilets in the girls bathroom (offset by the contribution from the preschool) and the payment of property taxes during the month.

Utilities for the month were below budget and are slightly over budget for the first five months.

All other budget items were at or below the budget for the first five months.

Overall our income for the first five months was \$132,226 and our expenses were \$129,527.

**Overall:** Bethania continues to meet its expenses through generous giving by our members. God has richly blessed us and we are committed to carrying out His will through our ministries in our church, our community, and our world. To God be the glory.

The June Memorial/Tribute Committee meeting was very rewarding. The most exciting thing was approving the purchase of two new American Range 36" ranges for the kitchen at a cost of \$7200, which includes the estimated installation. This was possible through the generosity of many people. Our new balance available for funding new projects is \$11,631.56. I attended the Church Council meeting to help clarify some ambiguities with our guidelines and ask for help with a vision for the future both with long and short-term goals. Both the council and the Memorial Committee expressed a desire to have a council liaison attend our meetings and Denise Johnson volunteered. We look forward to working with her.


