Pastor Chris's Message



The gospel is not a private announcement to private individuals about how to go to heaven when you die. The gospel is a public announcement to the whole world proclaiming that the kingdom of heaven has come and that God is now reigning over the nations through his Son Jesus Christ. – Brian Zahnd

I'm not sure what meaning you take from the above quote, but to help out, I'll tell you this about it: this quote isn't so much about how one chooses to interpret the Bible as much as it is about context – and context is everything!

This short quote from Reverend Brian Zahnd of Word of Life Church in St. Joseph, Missouri says more about how far our society has come from the time in which the New Testament was written than all of Luther's writings combined.

I would like you to wonder for yourself about the individualistic assumptions you've carried with you about our faith throughout your life. If you could even take a journey back in time and reflect on your assumptions about the work that God, especially God in Christ, has been doing and continues to do in our world. Do you find that you have assumed that Christ's purpose was about individual salvation? That God's grace is a gift given to each individual? That our response to that grace is about our own individual choices? If you've answered yes to any of these, as I have to all of them, odds are you have been raised in a faith that is a product of our own context, which celebrates the individual over the community. This isn't good or bad; it just is.

2,000 years ago this kind of assumption did not exist. Individualism was not a concept in the minds of those in antiquity, namely because to be an individual was death and to be part of a community was the key to survival. Everything written, learned, and understood in antiquity would have been from a communal mindset rather than an individual one. The directives from God, from the prophets, from Jesus would have been unquestionably for the communities who were sharing them and not the individuals living within them.

This might seem like a trite detail, but its implications are massive; so massive that our faith has been shaped more by this taken-for-granted detail than most anything else. Consider this: when Jesus tells us to love our neighbor, or give up our coat and give it to the poor, or to care for the orphan and widow, or to believe in him and receive the Bread of Life, or not to judge one another, or to forgive, or that the least among us will be the greatest, or that whoever lives by the sword dies by the sword (this list can go on and on), Jesus is not speaking to

us individually, but to us as a community. And not just us at Bethania, but every Christian across the world.

At some point, the Christian faith in the Western part of the world adopted the individualistic, consumerist model of its environment. People became less concerned about their community and more concerned about their individual salvation, heaven became less about a lived experience the community is called to know and more about a destination each individual is called to strive for, and the needs of the community, within which Christ calls us to experience his presence, fell to the wayside while the need of the individual took precedence.

Now here's the real ticker: imagine how different our world might be if we kept this communal understanding. Imagine the difference if we, as Christian-majority nations, took Christ's commands as communal commands, and not individual ones. Imagine how much we could have helped our communities if we pooled our human power and loved one another, together. It gives me chills thinking about it.

There's no time limit on when to start and the best place to start is with awareness. I'd be curious to know how this shapes your own understanding of your faith as you start to encounter God's word with this lens. And I'd be curious to know how this might give you a different call with how to interact with the world.

Day of Service Items Needed!

Our "Day of Service," an ELCA-wide event focusing on the needs of our communities and our world, is coming in September. We will be collecting items this summer for assembly of Lutheran World Relief Personal Care Kits, School Supplies, Blessing Bags and Brown Bag Breakfasts for Seniors.

Personal Care Kits help people dealing with some of life's most difficult situations –the aftermath of earthquakes and floods, fleeing home to escape violence, and living in extreme poverty. When LWR distributes Personal Care Kits, it's often to people who have lost everything to natural or man-made disasters.

School Kits are given to children to help them have the supplies to be able to attend school. Imagine having to choose between eating a meal or purchasing a notebook. In the places where LWR works, even a few required supplies, like pens and paper, may be more than many families can afford. And when parents can only afford to send one of their children to school, girls rarely get priority...yet the education level of mothers has the biggest impact on development.

Blessing Bags are items that will help the homeless or those in transition through a rough patch without a permanent shelter.

Brown Bag Breakfasts will be assembled to make sure that Seniors who are in financial need or who require assistance with meals have something to eat for breakfast. Many medications must be taken with food in the morning.

Here are the items we are collecting. Watch for sales and help us stock up!

Items needed are:

For Personal Care Kits:

Bath size towels (light to medium weight, between 20"x40" & 27"x52"), dark colors preferred

Bars of soap (4-5 oz., any brand, in original wrapping – 2 per kit)

Toothbrush (adult size, in original packaging – bulk buys can be repackaged by us)

Comb, sturdy wide toothed

Nail clippers (with or without nail files)

For School Supply Kits:

Box of Crayons (16 or 24 count)
Ballpoint Pens (not gel) – Blue or Black ink

Pencil sharpeners
Blunt tip scissors

For Blessing Bags (items must fit in large ziplock bag)

Socks (wool or thermal preferred)
Band-aids (big ones to cover blisters are nice)
EmergenC, Airborne, chewable multivitamins
Tuna/chicken salad cracker kits
Tissues
Wet wipes (individually packaged)
Breakfast bars or cereal bars (soft is better)
Peanut Butter crackers
Snack cups/applesauce/pudding cups
Water, juice boxes

Gloves that can be layered
Deodorant
Lip balm/chapstick
Sunscreen
Toothbrush and toothpaste
Beef Jerky
Mints or Gum
Raisins/dried fruit
Lotion

For Brown Bag Breakfasts:

Small boxes of Cereal or Oatmeal
Small juices, such as Sunny Delight or V8

Muffins (closer to the event)

As of July 29th you have generously donated \$1,127.29 to ELCA World Hunger Good Gifts Program. These funds provide baby chicks, pigs, sheep, goats, clean water wells and fruit trees to people around the world. Recipients are also trained on how to utilize these "good gifts".

This easy job entails setting up the table, helping bag people's choices, and counting and turning in the funds collected at the end of the coffee hour. “We Support the Troops” Donation Collection Day Saturday, Aug. 18th, 9 am-2 pm in the Parish Hall

We are hosting a Donation Collection Day on Saturday, Aug.18th, from 9 am-2 pm for SYV We Support The Troops. On the fourth Wednesday of each month, Santa Ynez Valley We Support the Troops Inc. prepares approximately 100 “care packages” for American service members stationed in countries such as Iraq, Afghanistan, Syria and South Korea. The group is looking for donations to help them meet the needs of soldiers serving overseas.

The recipients are usually but not always connected to someone from the Santa Ynez Valley, whether it's a relative, a friend or a co-worker. Troop members send letters requesting things such as jerky, wet wipes, shampoo and body wash, batteries, and sanitary items for women. The current list is also available at their website www.we-support-the-troops.org. or at <https://www.bethanialutheran.net>.

Since 2004, “We Support the Troops” has been providing the care packages at no cost to our men and women in military service. This all-volunteer effort is charged with soliciting the generous donations of supporters, purchasing the necessary goods desired, packaging and mailing to our troops. Each box sent includes a personal letter. 100% of donated funds are used to support this effort.

Volunteers gather on the fourth Wednesday of each month at Bethania to prepare and pack the boxes to be shipped. Volunteers are always welcome; contact Caro Stinson at 805-245-4951.

Church Business

Treasurer's Report June 2018

Balance Sheet:

The cash position is significantly lower than the \$10,000 threshold we would like to see on the balance sheet in the general checking account. You will also note that the money market fund has dropped by nearly \$15,000. This is due to the significant expenditures we experienced in the month of June. We purchased the new stoves (over \$7,500) remodeled the boys bathroom (approximately \$4,700), remodeled the girls bathroom (\$2,200), and did some electrical repairs. The reduction in the cash in the money market fund is offset by the increase in the fixed assets of the church.

All liabilities are current with the exception of the normal pension liability.

In spite of the reduction of the cash, the balance sheet remains healthy.

Profit and Loss Budget Performance:

Income:

Offerings for the month were \$2,335 below budget, but are at 99% of the year to date.

Other income was \$1,100 over budget for the month and \$8,000 over for the first 6 months.

Other receipts were over budget by \$657 for the month.

Overall income for the month was \$559 below budget for the month, but we are at 113% of budget for the first six months.

Expenses:

Salary and benefits for the month was \$975 below budget, and for the first six months at 97% of budget.

Staff expenses were well controlled at 87% of budget for the first six months.

Office administration was below budget by \$233 for the month, and at 93% of budget for the first six months.

Property expenses were below budget for the month, but are 105% of the budget for the year. Due largely to increased repairs and property taxes.

Utilities were below budget by \$337, but are still at 105% of budget for the year.

Youth committee expenses were significantly over budget due to the Houston trip, but funds were contributed for that purpose and therefore offset the expenses.

Overall expenses for the month exceeded income by nearly \$5,000, however total income for the first six months exceeded expenses by \$7,000.

Overall:

Bethania continues to be a blessing to the community, to its members, and to the world. While offerings were down for the month of June, that is fairly normal for us. We all need to be mindful that the church's expenses continue through vacation periods, and that we depend on our members generous support for our mission.

Pastor Chris reported on the Youth bringing our donations to support “Farmers to the Youth Gathering” in Houston and the emotional interactive displays that were featured. Thank you to all who helped by contributing to the Noisy Offering for this event.

We have been discussing areas of need in the SYV. A large need is for Meals on Wheels Drivers (both Buellton and Solvang), and help for Pam Gnekow at the Buellton Senior Center. If you can help, contact the church office or the Senior Center.

If you are interested in making a difference in the world, think about attending the next Social Ministry meeting on **Aug. 13th at 6:00** in the evening, in the church office. We would love to have input from anyone interested and we welcome all who are interested. We also love having your support, so read the Beacon for ways to help.

Help us build a foundation that will help others and bring our church into the next few decades with new involvement in our community.
