## Context is Everything



### Did you know...

- The story of Cain and Abel is really a story about shepherding being replaced by farming in civilization?
- There are about 5 different authors of Genesis?
- Every time you read the word "hell", the actual word is Gehenna and it was a dumpsite outside of Jerusalem where lepers lived and found food?
- Of the 13 letters attributed to Paul, only 7 were actually written by him, and the other 6 were written in his name after he died?
- The Book of Revelation is not about the end of the world, but instead

is a commentary against the Roman Empire?

While there are minimal implications in some of these facts, there are much greater implications in how we read others. For example, the apocalypse genre in antiquity was highly allegorical and often used colorful language about God's powers toward those of the world. Its author, John of Patmos (not the same as John the disciple – more context!), was writing to Christians to remind them that God comes out victorious through the death of Christ against all oppressive forces on Earth. While many have taken this as a letter of fear and trepidation, it is actually a letter of hope for those experiencing persecution. That is why African slaves in America gravitated towards its message of victory and why so many African Christian songs use language from Revelation. The same can be said of people in Latin America in the 1970s and 80s.

However, among predominately Anglo-European people Revelation was interpreted as this manuscript for the coming end of the world. This might seem like simple fantasy, but because of this misreading of the last book of the Bible, actual American Foreign Policy towards the Middle East has been affected. Among Evangelicals, there is the belief that Israel needs to be restored to borders described in the Bible prior to Israel's defeat and exile by Babylon in the 6th century BCE, in order for the apocalypse to commence. For anyone who has read about the controversy over Jewish settlements in the West Bank, a lot of support for these settlements from Americans is founded in interpreting Revelation in this way. While I fully support Israel and its citizens' right to exist peacefully, I also believe God's desire is for humanity to coexist peacefully. I also fundamentally believe God weeps at the mistreatment of any person based on not reading the Bible in its own context.

My overall point is that there is a lot of weight in how we read this 2,000-year-old book. We all read the Bible subjectively, but there are great and sometimes grave consequences to those interpretations. What I hope to leave you with this month is not an overwhelming sense

when approaching your own reading of the Bible, but rather a new hope in how you read it. Every time you read scripture, ask yourself, "Who wrote this?", "Who were they writing to?", and "What was happening in their world when they wrote it?". Any New Revised Standard Version (NRSV) Study Bible will give you the answers to these questions. You'll also find that these three questions not only change the way you read the Bible, but will also change how the Bible affects your perspective on life today. My ultimate hope is that you'll discover how alive God's Word truly is today!

# Church Business

## Treasurer's Report August 2018

### **Balance Sheet:**

The cash position was in the negative at -\$2,371 at the end of the month. This was due to a drop in monthly income from the budgeted amount. While this is a concern, it is normal for the month of August to be lowest income of the year.

The money market fund was up by over \$6,000 due to the addition of the "19 in 90" campaign to refinish the pews. The fund is at \$88,917.00.

The remainder of the balance sheet accounts are stable compared to the previous month.

All accounts are current, and there is no indebtedness to the church.

The balance sheet remains strong.

### **Profit & Loss, Budget Performance:**

#### **Income:**

Offerings for the month were \$2,109 below budget. However, offerings for the first 8 months were at 99% of budget. This is noteworthy, as we normally see a reduction in income for the summer months.

Other income for the month was over budget and significantly over budget for the first 8 months (129% of budget).

Other receipts were below budget for the month but were over for the first 8 months.

Total income for the month was \$3,862 below budget. However, total income for the first 8 months was 107% of budget, \$198,381 compared to \$184,38 budgeted. (**Note:** the figure we show as below budget for the months explains the negative balance in the general checking for the month.)

#### **Expenses:**

Benevolences were on budget for the month, and over for the first 8 months.

Salaries & benefits were slightly below budget for the month and are at 98% of budget for the first 8 months.

Staff expenses were below budget for the month, and are at 79% of budget for the first 8 months.

Office administration expenses were below budget for the month (by \$173) and reflect 95% of budget for the first 8 months.

Property expenses were slightly below budget for the month, but were at 105% of budget for the first 8 months.

Utilities were under budget by \$157 for the month, but were over budget at 102% of budget for the first 8 months.

Christian Education was under budget for the month, but is 138% of budget for the first 8 months. This was due to the VBS expenses, but they were offset by the increase in income for VBS.

Worship & Music expenses were over budget for the first 8 months largely due to the organ maintenance line item.

Overall expenses for the month were below budget by \$1,850. However, for the first 8 months were at 107% of budget. This is offset by the 107% of income for the first 8 months.

**Overall:** Bethania continues to be a vibrant, healthy congregation. Our members support the ministries of the church and we are a blessing to the community and the world. Thanks be to God for all of our wonderful members and staff.
